Ash Wednesday, like the season of Lent, is never mentioned in the Bible; Christians are free either to observe it or not. We will be offering the service at **7:00pm** on **Wednesday, February 17**.

Campaign Followup

At 22 months into our 36-month *Building on Faith* capital campaign, we have received nearly **65%** of funds pledged. Well done, church! And what a joy to be worshipping in the new building.

To those who have pledged to the *Building on Faith* capital campaign, please continue to give against those pledges. (And thank you very much for what you've given to date.) To those who have so freely given to the building fund outside the campaign, we thank you too!

The final draw from the construction loan is anticipated within days to pay the general contractor for completion of the work. The balance of the loan will be a bit less than the \$3 million available to be borrowed. Now we set about reducing the sum of that loan.

The terms of our loan require us to pay interest only for the next 12 months; following that period the balance of the loan will be amortized over 19 years and we will be paying both principal and interest.

Every gift now given to *Building on Faith* or the building fund reduces the principal we owe as well as the interest we pay today *and* the interest we'll pay over the next 19 years. To lessen the burden of debt on those coming alongside us now and those who will follow us all is an incredible gift to them; it will allow the church of the next generation to focus more greatly on bringing the good news to their generation.

While *Building on Faith* does not conclude until April 1, 2011, you who are able might consider **prepaying the balance of your pledge** to immediately reduce the principal of the loan and the interest due each month.

Those of you who have become a part of our congregation since the launch of the campaign two years ago, might you also give a special gift to reduce the debt? Designate your gift "Building Fund."

Above all, **receive the thanks of a grateful church for each dollar given**, many of which have been given sacrificially. And we thank and praise God who has brought us this far on our journey. While the building is now built, may God bless us to continue building his church.

Further Notes on Financing the New Building

Ralph Snyder, Chair of Finance

The land on which the church has been built was paid for in full through our first capital campaign, *A Journey of Faith*. The cost of the land was \$1.275 million dollars. Because of your generosity, we began construction with no money owed on the land.

The cost of the new church building is \$3.8 million dollars.

Pledges on the present campaign total 1.5 million dollars

Approximately \$500,000 of the amount pledged remains to be paid between now and the conclusion of *Building on Faith* April 1, 2011.

Loans to Build the Church - Approximate balances as of February 1, 2010

Loan A - \$900,000 @ 3.75% interest rate

Loan B - \$2,100,000 @ 4.25% interest rate

The interest rates can and probably will increase during the life of the loans.

Payment Schedule - From February 1, 2010 through February 1, 2011 interest only is required to be paid on the two loans.

Loan A \$900,000 @ 3.75% equals \$2,812.50 per month (interest only)

Loan B \$2,100,000 @ 4.25% equals \$7,437.50 per month (interest only)

Total monthly interest only payments equal \$10,250.

(For purposes of comparison, the monthly payment on rent and improvements at Executive Way was \$15,335 when we moved out in 2007.)

For the remaining 19 years of the 20 year loan period, both interest and principal are to be paid on both loans. The monthly payment amounts due beginning February 1, 2011 will depend on the principal amounts unpaid on February 1, 2011.

In order to reduce the principal balances on these two loans as quickly as possible (and reduce the interest paid on the loans), we ask everyone who can to prepay their remaining pledge amounts. We ask those who've not pledged to give what they can to further reduce the principal of the loans.

Thank you for your consideration of these matters. Even if we simply fulfill the outstanding *Building on Faith* pledges in a timely manner, your Finance Team believes we'll come out okay. But what a tremendous opportunity we have in the months ahead to reduce payments of the next 19 years!

Finally, thank you for your faithful giving toward both the building and the general budget of Ponte Vedra United Methodist Church. Without the sacrificial gifts of so many we would not be in the place to which God has brought us today. Praise God!

Someone tried to convert me last night.

I'm part of this men's Bible study that meets every other week. None of these guys is a member of PVUMC though all happen to be United Methodist. All except one; he's a member of a church of another denomination who joined our Bible study a few months back. And that's the guy who tried to convert me (the whole group of us, really) to his brand of Christianity.

When it became apparent what he was doing, I asked him point blank if he had joined our Bible study in order to convert us. He admitted that he had. I'm angry about that. What adjective might I use to describe his actions... Duplicitous, deceitful, beguiling, two faced? I thought we were journeying together through the very challenging book of Revelation, growing closer to Christ and each other along the way. Turns out he just wanted us to buy into his view of the Bible and the "proper" practice of the Christian faith.

As I drove home I got to thinking about how we who have a passion for sharing Christ should relate to people who are not Christians. I hope we'll be willing to walk with them, listening to and respecting them as we travel together. And I hope we won't pretend to be anything other than who we are.
