The Giving Tree

Last year's giving tree was popular with both our generous church family and with those served by **B.E.A.M.** (Beaches Emergency Assistance Ministry). To participate, take a Publix gift card from *The Giving Tree* in the sanctuary and have Publix "charge it up" in an amount of \$15, \$20 or \$25. Place it in the offering plate the following Sunday and we will get the cards to BEAM where staffers will distribute them to those in need of diapers, formula and food items not available in the BEAM pantry.

Year End Giving Welcomed!

Tax Saving Ideas from Your Stewardship Ministry Team

1. Capital Gains Tax Savings: You can lower the final cost of your support for PVUMC by donating stocks or mutual funds to fund your pledge. Donating stock or mutual fund shares; i.e., not cash, will save you from paying capital gains tax on any appreciation in value of these securities, a potential of up to 15% savings. Check your stock and mutual fund statements (which are not tax deferred accounts such as IRA's or 401K) and see if your situation makes it advantageous to donate securities. If so, call your broker or mutual fund provider and they can assist you in making this donation. Our accountant Jim Larsen (jim.larsen@pv-umc.org) can provide you our brokerage account information. If you have questions contact Bob Spooner or Ralph Snyder. Note: For tax years 2011 and 2012, capital gains tax rates are zero for single taxpayers with taxable income of \$34,500 or less and for married, filing jointly and qualifying widow(er) with taxable income of \$69,000 or less.

2. If you're 70 ½ or older, you must take a Minimum Required Distribution from your regular or rollover IRA (not a Roth IRA). Only in 2011, you can make a direct contribution from your IRA to the church which counts toward your Minimum Required Distribution but will not be included in your taxable income. Your broker or mutual fund provider can assist you in making this donation. You can contact Bob Spooner (bob.spooner@pv-umc.org) or Ralph Snyder (ralph.snyder@pv-umc.org) with questions.

The Alpha Course: Explore the Meaning of Life

What is Alpha?

Alpha is an opportunity to explore the meaning of life in a relaxed, friendly setting. The Alpha course meets weekly for 10 weeks, and includes an amazing one-day getaway. Each session people enjoy sharing food, laughter and learning in a fun and friendly atmosphere where no question about life or God is seen as too simple or too hostile...questions like – Is there a God? Why am I here? Where did I come from? Where am I going?

Alpha is for anyone...anyone who thinks there may be more to life than meets the eye.

People attend from all backgrounds, religions, and viewpoints. They come to investigate questions about the existence of God, the purpose of life, the afterlife, the claims of Jesus and more. Some people want to get beyond religion and find a relationship with God that really changes life. Others come for the close, long-lasting friendships that are built during the Alpha course.

Many guests have never been to church, others may have attended church occasionally but feel they have never really understood the basics of the Christian faith. Everyone is welcome.

The talks each week cover the following topics, acting as a springboard for the small group discussions:

Introduction: Is there more to life than this?

Week 1: Who is Jesus?

Week 2: Why did Jesus die?

Week 3: How can we have faith?

Week 4: Why and how do I pray?

Week 5: Why and how should I read the Bible?

Week 6: How does God guide us?

Week 7: How can I resist evil?

Week 8: Why & how should we tell others?

Week 9: Does God heal today?

Week 10: What about the Church?

Weekend: Who is the Holy Spirit?
